ASIL SPONSORS WEB EVENT ON US-EU REGULATORY HARMONIZATION

WASHINGTON, DC – The American Society of International Law (ASIL) will host an hour-long, web-based event on **Thursday, February 22, 2007, at 11:00 am**, Eastern Time. The webinar is entitled *Transatlantic Regulatory Harmonization: The Way to Increased Trade, Investment, and Cooperation between the US and the EU?* The program will explore German Chancellor and EU President Angela Merkel's initiative to boost transatlantic trade through the harmonization of US and EU regulatory requirements. The presentation will give an overview of Chancellor Merkel's proposal and examine the prospects for achievement of its goals. ASIL member **Lewis Leibowitz**, a partner at the law firm Hogan and Hartson who specializes in international trade law, will present the program. Presenter **Lewis Leibowitz** practices in the areas of international trade law, customs law, and international commercial transactions. He represents clients before all federal courts and agencies dealing with international trade matters. As a member of Hogan and Hartson's legislative as well as international trade group, Mr. Leibowitz is active in legislative matters affecting international trade law and policy and works extensively in matters affecting US foreign trade zones (FTZs). Mr. Leibowitz has also served as an Adjunct Professor at the University of Maryland Law School.
