### **ASIL PUBLICATION WINS GOLD CIRCLE AWARD**

WASHINGTON, DC – The American Society of International Law (ASIL) is proud to announce that its electronic publication *International Judicial Monitor* has won a 2007 *Communication Gold Circle Award* from the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE) and The Center for Association Leadership. Of the 18 associations recognized this year, ASIL’s *International Judicial Monitor* won for best “Membership Periodical or E-newsletter [with an] association budget of \$2 million or less.”

“Congratulations to this year’s recipients of the Gold Circle Award for their innovative communication campaigns and strategies,” said ASAE President and CEO John H. Graham, IV. “These efforts demonstrate what tremendous creative talent is found in the association workforce.”

First launched in March 2006 and produced as a joint project of ASIL and the International Judicial Academy, the *International Judicial Monitor* is a free, bi-monthly electronic publication designed specifically for the judicial community. Each issue of the *Monitor* features links to international legal resources; profiles of international judges and tribunals; recent cases of note involving the domestic application of international law; descriptions of general principles of international law; a calendar of rule of law-related events; and perspective pieces from judges across the globe.
