*Proceedings of the First International Humanitarian Law Dialogs* is a record of the proceedings of an historic meeting of international prosecutors at the Chautauqua Institution on August 29, 2007, in honor of the 100th anniversary of the Hague Rules of 1907. Edited by ASIL Executive Director **Elizabeth Andersen** and Syracuse University School of Law Professor **David M. Crane**, the book includes speeches, and commemorative papers, as well as summaries of dialogs on the history, procedure, and jurisprudence of international tribunals from Nuremberg to the International Criminal Court. *Guiding Principles on Internal Displacement: Annotations* is an updated and revised resource, authored by the UN Secretary General's Representative on the Human Rights of Internally Displaced Persons, **Walter Kälin**. A joint project of ASIL, the Brookings Institution,

and the University of Bern's Project on Internal Displacement, this book clarifies and explains the key aspects of the *Guiding Principles* and their legal antecedents. *Annotations* provides an in-depth understanding of the *Principles* for the legal community and for others seeking to strengthen international law so that it might better protect internally displaced persons. (Though they are displaced from their homes, internally displaced persons do not benefit from protection as refugees under international law, because they have not crossed an international border.)
