Eligibility & Expectations:

- Must be a current APIG Member or willing to become one.
- Should be a **mid-career or well-established scholar or practitioner** in international law. We would also consider emerging scholars with a solid track record in research and/or practice, alongside considerable connections to the region or regional issues.
- Responsible for coordinating content, liaising with contributors, and overseeing editorial standards.
- Will work closely with APIG Co-Chairs, Advisory Board Members and the newsletter team.

This is a highly visible role within the APIG community and offers a platform to contribute meaningfully to regional legal discourse.

APIG is also inviting applications for a **Media and Communications Coordinator** to join our team. This role is ideal for a **junior scholar or early-career professional** with a passion for international law and digital engagement.

Eligibility & Expectations:

- Must be a current APIG Member or willing to become one.
- Will be responsible for promoting APIG activities, publications, and events across platforms such as LinkedIn and others.
- Familiar with social media platforms and able to synthesize short, concise messages for our online community.
- Will work collaboratively with the APIG Co-Chairs, Advisory Board and the newsletter team, among others to support broader outreach efforts.

This is a great opportunity to gain visibility in the field and contribute to APIG's growing online presence. You would be part of the voice of APIG, interacting online with members of APIG community and many others.
