The International Legal Theory Interest Group (ILT IG) of the American Society of International Law (ASIL) is pleased to announce the call for submissions for the 2025 International Legal Theory Scholarship Prize. The prize is to be awarded to the author(s) of an article or book chapter that the Selection Committee deems outstanding in the field of international legal theory. The winner of the prize will be formally announced at the 2026 ASIL Annual Meeting.

### Eligibility

The Selection Committee will consider scholarly publications exploring issues in international legal theory, broadly understood. Eligible works include articles and chapters from edited volumes published in the English language between January 1, 2024 and December 31, 2025.

Both sole- and jointly-authored submissions are welcome. Membership in ASIL is not required. Submissions from scholars working anywhere in the world are welcome; however, as part of the Prize's mandate to encourage scholarship on international legal theory within the United States, preference may be given to scholars based at an institution in the United States. While submissions from scholars at all stages of their career are welcome, preference may be given to early career or pretenure professors.

#### **Selection Committee**

The Selection Committee will be composed of individuals with scholarly expertise in international legal theory to be appointed by the Co-Chairs.

#### **Prize**

The winner of the International Legal Theory Scholarship Prize will receive:

- A certificate of recognition
- A one-year complimentary membership in ASIL
- Public recognition at the ASIL Annual Meeting in April 2025 and promotion through ASIL channels
- An opportunity may also be provided to present the winning work at an Interest Group workshop.

#### **Submission Process**

Submissions must be received by **January 30, 2026** at 5:00 p.m. EST. Only electronic submissions will be accepted. Submissions must include:

- A statement by email confirming the submission's eligibility
- The article or book chapter (in PDF format)
- The author's contact information (email, phone, address)
- A curriculum vitae or résumé
